

FORM SUMMARY

Name of Form: Order For Final Hearing Or Dismissal

Form Number: ME-910

Statutory Reference: §§51.20(7), (8), and (9), Wis. Stats.

Purpose of Form: This document either dismisses the matter or, if probable cause is found, binds the case over for final hearing, authorizes further detention or conditional release, and appoints examiners.

Who Completes It: Corporation counsel or the court

Distribution of Form: Original to court, copies to subject, counsel, examiners, treatment provider and detention facility (if different)

Accompanying Forms: An order for involuntary medication and treatment form (ME-905) may be attached. If the county uses standardized examiner report form, copies of that form may be included with the copy sent to the examiners.

New Form/Modification: Modification, last update 4/95.

Modifications: Added a file/date stamp to upper right corner. Added a statement on the bottom indicating that the form shall not be modified.

Comments: If the subject had initially accepted treatment as a condition of release pending the final hearing, but later fails to comply with the conditions, the subject may then be detained. The final hearing must be held within 14 days of the date of that detention, but not later than 30 days from the date of the probable cause hearing. If the original date scheduled fits within these parameters, no new notice would be required. If the final hearing must be moved up to accommodate these limitations, then a new hearing must be scheduled with notice sent to all who received the original notice. The court appointed examiners must be advised of any change moving the date forward because it will affect the deadline for their reports to be filed.
